In the Rochester, NY area, FoodLink is a source of well-deserved pride. Starting in 1978 with a busload of donated English muffins, the non-profit has grown into a 500-member organization distributing more than 19 million pounds of food and resources each year. In 2016, [FoodLink](#) relocated down the street from Kodak Alaris' offices on Mt. Read Boulevard. On November 6th, 2017, our team of 20 Rochester employees pulled into the FoodLink parking lot to start that Monday morning as volunteer food inspectors.



Safety first

Performing safety checks on donated food, we verified expiration dates, ensured ingredients were complete and readable, and checked for dents that could compromise the integrity of cans. The canned goods that passed inspection were then sorted into categorized boxes, weighed, and ready for distribution. At the end, we were glad to have been a small link in this charitable food chain.

They serve meals through their commercial kitchen and offer more than 30 food-related programs. This regional food hub also serves as the [Feeding America](#) food bank for Allegany, Genesee, Livingston, Monroe, Ontario, Orleans, Seneca, Wayne, Wyoming, and Yates counties.
